His Legacy *Harold Bernard Banks*

On September 22, 1949 in Jacksonville, Florida, our Heavenly Father entrusted the life of Harold Bernard Banks to John T. and Elizabeth Banks who provided unwavering love, vigilant protection, and all-encompassing support.

At the age of three, Harold became a partial paraplegic due to an accident. However, most people who knew Harold are aware that his physical disability **NEVER** prevented him from doing any and everything his heart desired. This included playing and coaching sports, dancing, singing, and becoming a pool shark. Harold's herculean upper body strength permitted him to be an amazing swimmer and fighter. In fact, his disability birthed his character throughout his life.

At an early age Harold was baptized by the late Rev. Richard L. Wilson, Sr at West Friendship Baptist Church. He attended the local schools, West Jacksonville Elementary, James Weldon Johnson Jr. High, New Stanton High and ultimately graduated from Eugene J. Butler Jr. and Sr. High in the class of 1968. While attending Butler he acquired the name "00 Crutch" (Double 0 Crutch), then later acquired the lifelong name, "Spider".

Harold's employment included several telemarketing positions, counseling, and Assistant Manager of Contract Marketing and Sales at Clean Master Janitorial Service.

Harold was an avid lover of animals and throughout his life he adopted several stray dogs and provided tender loving care for each of them. Harold's most recent love was his beautiful little yorkshire terrier Jasmine, affectionately known as "Jazzy".

Harold was preceded in death by a brother, Jimmie L. Banks and father, John T Banks. He leaves to cherish his memory a loving and dedicated mother, Mrs. Elizabeth Banks; brother, Alphonso T. Banks; sisters, Belinda Gail Bentley (Kenneth), Sharon Prier (Roosevelt) and Arleen Rodgers (Henry); a dedicated and devoted friend, Edward "Champ" Emanuel; friend and "Guardian Angel", Ms. Helen James; and a host of loving nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
