Dear Granddaddy,

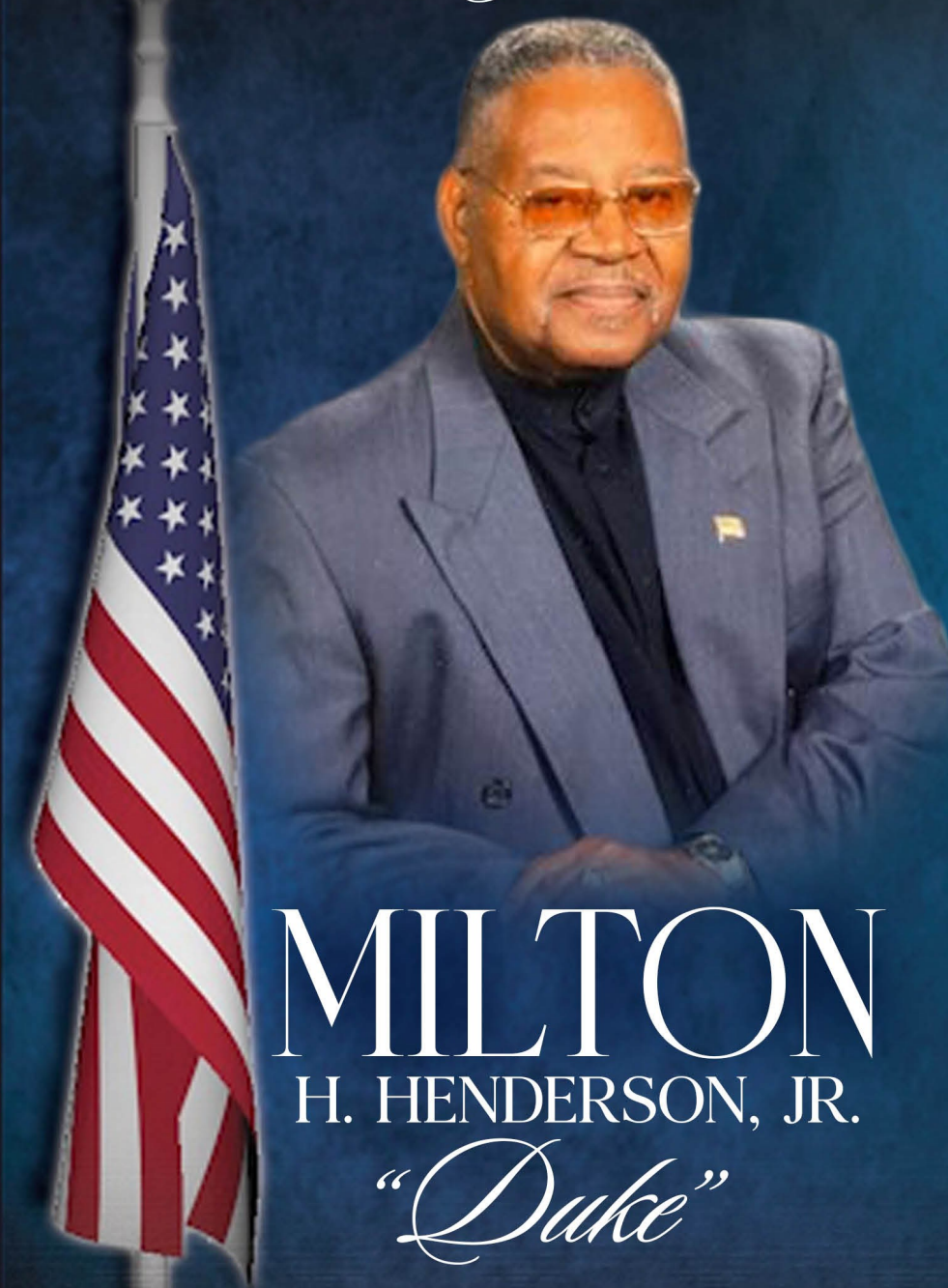

MILTON H. HENDERSON, JR., affectionately known as "Duke" was born on January 16, 1938 in Cincinnati, OH to Milton H. Henderson Sr. and Mary Jackson.
